It is right for parents to keep track of the use and misuse of technology by their children; it is wrong to assume that children will do the right thing without any guidance.

Working together, we can keep our children safe from harm so that they have the opportunity to be the leaders of the world of tomorrow. One way to help our children is to expect them to do what is right; that is, we should expect them to do what they have been taught *at home and at school*. We need to have moral and ethical leaders in the future - don't you agree?

After viewing the exhibit, the students had the opportunity to recreate a pose in the style of Norman Rockwell's famous magazine covers. Back at school, the other two classes worked with their homeroom teachers on a creative writing project based on Norman Rockwell's famous World War II illustration *Freedom from Want*.
